 the 16th bridge school benefit concerts

With the release of *Are You Passionate?* in April 2002 Young embarked upon a six-date promotional tour. The first, a TV performance on *The Tonight Show*, featured the title song from the album; the second was preparation for four proposed appearances in Europe.

Having recorded and released the album, Young set out with 'Duck' Dunn (bass), Booker T. Jones (organ), Frank Sampedro (guitar) and Steve Potts (drums). Pegi and Astrid Young were on hand to provide backing vocals. The warm-up show in Redwood City gave a clear indication of what he had in mind. The set included eight songs from the new album—*Differently, You're My Girl, Are You Passionate?, Goin' Home, Let's Roll, Quit (Don't Say You Love Me), She's A Healer* and *Two Old Friends*. These were to feature at all of the shows during May. The first of these was a performance at the Nürburgring during the 'Rock Am Ring' Festival which was broadcast live in Germany by WDR on Rockpalast. The two shows in Germany were expected to be followed by two

shows in London. Sylvie Simmons reviewed the Brixton Academy show for *Mojo*: "...but it's on stirring Hurricanesque anthem *Goin' Home* that a shift seems to occur, as if Young, sensing the crowd's energy, changes tack for a high-power approach. Perhaps too high, since after a splendid 'Powderfinger' he mutters something about taking a 10-minute break and the band abruptly leave the stage." Young reportedly stepped outside for some fresh air and the dates at Brixton became one when he cancelled the second night after catching a chill. Many fans arrived at the venue the next day unaware of the situation and were disappointed to miss the show but were generally sympathetic. To be fair, Young had rarely cancelled concerts through illness.

Once again 2003 finished in traditional fashion. A Farm Aid appearance in Burgettstown—a seven-song solo set—and two Bridge School shows. It was at the latter, when Young played the last song of his ten-song solo acoustic sets—*Falling From Above*—that fans got an inkling of his next move.
